Preliminary remarks

The roots of the compositional process: the Italian Masters of the 20th century and contemporary Composers

The Valentino Bucchi Foundation, in collaboration with the Accademia Filarmonica Romana, announces the 42nd edition of the International Composition Competition, the Valentino Bucchi Award. This edition is dedicated to the relation of continuity and innovation between the works of the Italian Masters of the 20th-century and the new compositions from contemporary authors. All participants must present an original composition for solo instrument either with or without electronic support, based on a connection to a significative work from an Italian composer of the 20th century, including Goffredo Petrassi, Luigi Dallapiccola, Valentino Bucchi, Bruno Maderna, Luigi Nono, Luciano Berio, Francesco Pennisi e Franco Donatoni. The purpose of the requirement on the reference to the 20th century Italian Masters is to stress both the connections in the artistic research over time and the complexity of the relation between past and present in the compositional process. The Valentino Bucchi Award continues in the choice of cultural and artistic policy that has characterized it since its first inception, aiming at promoting young talent and individual creativity in the field of pure research, experimentation, and culturally distinguished music. This edition is dedicated to composition for solo instruments. The choice is aimed at the development and expansion of the repertoire for solo instruments within the aspects of artistic content and idiomatic writing for the individual instruments chosen by the candidates. In consideration of the growing participation of electronic music in the field of contemporary composition, largely determined by the proximity, cross fertilization and synergy between compositional research and the vast gamut of solutions offered by the electronic medium, it has been decided to offer the possibility of presenting, at the free choice of the contestant, compositions for either solo instrument alone, or for solo instrument plus electronic support.

Contest Rules

Art. 1 (Subject matter)

The contest is dedicated to compositions for solo instrument, with or without electronic support. The compositions must be based on a connection to a significative work from an Italian composer of the 20th century, according to the rules explained in the Art.3

Art. 2 (Participants)

- a) The competition is open to composers from all countries born in 1980 or later.
- b) The winners of the first prize in previous editions of the *Valentino Bucchi Prize* are excluded from participation.

Art. 3 (Registration procedures, rules and characteristics required)

a) The participants must send the score of the composition to the following address no later than August 31, 2023:

- b) Competitors must comply with the following rules and requirements:
- 1. the connection to a significant work from the 20th-century Italian Masters, including Goffredo Petrassi, Luigi Dallapiccola, Valentino Bucchi, Bruno Maderna, Luigi Nono, Luciano Berio, Francesco Pennisi e Franco Donatoni, must be stated in a legend accompanied by the explaination of the criteria used and/or a brief analysis.
- 2. it has to be noted that the reference to a significant work from the 20th-century Italian Masters can be freely made by the competitor. The type of reference may range from quoting one or more fragments to using the thematic areas consistently, from reelaborating a section of the work to interpreting it and transforming it according to all the solutions that their own expertise and imagination can suggest.
- 3. the compositions must not exceed a maximum of twelve minutes in duration;
- 4. works already awarded prizes in other competitions are not admitted;
- 5. works that require a second performer for live electronics are not allowed;
- 6. works already performed both in concert and in the didactic field are accepted;
- 7. the competitor has the right but, to be emphasized, no obligation to send a recorded performance, in audio or video format, of the work presented to the competition;
- 8. the competitor has the right to participate in the competition with a maximum number of two works;
- 9. two hard copies of each composition are required, and each of them must include: first name and surname of the competitor, place and date of birth, nationality, title, duration of the composition, and the statement, in the legend, regarding the reference to a relevant work from the Italian Authors of the 20th century (please see B1 and B2).
- 10. a digital copy in PDF format, with the same indications mentioned above, to be sent to the following email address: **bucchi@premiobucchi.it**
- 11. a copy of the electronic medium, in the case of composition for solo plus electronic support;
- 12. the application for participation in the competition must be completed as for all the requirements indicated in the attached Registration Form supplemented by the Privacy Policy.

Art. 4 (Structure of the competition)

The competition is divided into two phases:

a) First phase (selection of finalists)

The jury, on the basis of the evaluation of the scores received will select up to a maximum of seven composers who will be admitted to the second phase of the competition.

- b) Second phase (final concert)
- 1. the works produced will be performed in a public concert that will be broadcast online in live streaming on the YouTube channel of the Accademia Filarmonica Romana and subsequently there will be a repeat performance organized by the Valentino Bucchi Foundation;
- 2. the final concert is scheduled for November the 25th, 2023 as part of the 2023/24 Artistic Season of the Accademia Filarmonica Romana, at the Sala Casella, via Flaminia 118, Rome:
- 3. the performance of the scores will be entrusted to instrumentalists chosen in agreement with the Accademia Filarmonica Romana;
- 4. the announcement of the winning work of the Valentino Bucchi Award will be communicated within a week of the final concert and publicised on the website of the Accademia Filarmonica Romana, the Valentino Bucchi Foundation as well as via national music channels and broadcasting stations.

Art. 5 (Valentino Bucchi Award)

The competition assigns the single and indivisible *Valentino Bucchi Award*.

- All finalist competitors will receive a certificate of merit and will participate in the public concert scheduled in collaboration with the Accademia Filarmonica Romana which will be broadcast in live streaming as well as recorded;
- b) the author of the winning work will obtain a grant which consists of the reimbursement of expenses of 2,000.00 euros gross and involvement in a subsequent concert as part of the artistic activities of the Accademia Filarmonica Romana;
- c) the jury will have the right to assign "honorable mentions" to finalist competitors who have not won the first prize.

Art. 6 (Competition Jury)

The jury is composed of Maestros: Claudio Ambrosini, Matteo D'Amico, James Dashow, Mario Mary, Marco Uvietta.

- a) The jury will appoint the president who will guide the evaluation procedure;
- b) the decisions taken by the jury will be final;
- c) the jury will also retain the ultimate right not to award the first prize provided for according to art. 5 of these Regulations.

Art. 7 (Amendments to the Regulations)

The organizational management of the prize reserves the right to make any changes deemed necessary to these regulations should reasons of force majeure require.

Art. 8 (Registration fee)

All competitors must pay an entry fee of 80,00 Euros, for each of the compositions submitted to the competition. This may be done by bank transfer payable to:
